INTRODUCTION

Netaji Subhash Mahavidyalaya began its journey in the year 1979 from Kirit Bikram Institution, a renowned Higher Secondary School at the heart of Udaipur Town with only 35 students, and shifted to its present location in May 1986. It is a co-educational, day college located in rural area under Paschim Dhwajanagar Gram Panchayat. The College received recognition from the University Grants Commission (UGC) under 2f and 12B on 31st March 2004.

VISION OF THE COLLEGE

Netaji Subhash Mahavidyalaya aims at instilling insight and cognitive ability into the minds of its students so that they can generate an enriched environment for the world with their sensitive and competent nature. The College strives to chisel out the latent individual talent through inclusive education that encourages unity in diversity and enhances emotional quotient among the students. The Vision Statement of the college, 'Sâ bidyâ i â bimuktâ' which means "that is knowledge, which liberates", underscores the idea that knowledge liberates one's soul and leads it towards self actualization.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND FACILITIES

Classrooms: College has 24 classrooms with electricity, solar connectivity, green boards etc. 06 classrooms are equipped with ICT facilities like projectors, smart TVs and internet connection.

Laboratory: College has well equipped laboratories with instruments & other required facilities for all Science departments. In Arts discipline, the college has well equipped laboratories for the Departments of Psychology and Geography. Language laboratory facility is available with the Department of English.

Library: The College is endowed with a semi-automated library having 38781 text and reference books. Library OPAC is available under the e-Granthalaya platform. The college has NLIST (INFLIBNET) subscription which offers online access to study materials like e-books and e-journals both for students and teachers.

Computer Centre: The College has a computer centre maintained by Computer Science department of the college with fifty-two (52) computers.

Sports Facilities: The College has a play ground for outdoor sports and an 'Indoor Sports Facilities Centre' equipped with 'Multi Gym' and a 'Yoga Centre' for improving fitness level of the students and also for other indoor games.

Safety and Security Measures: All the buildings of the College and College canteen are kept under CCTV surveillance. Fire extinguishers are installed in strategic locations in all buildings

Hostel: The college maintains a hostel for the ST boy students with fifty seats capacity. Students coming from distant and remote places with BPL/EWS background are given top priority at the time of selection of ST students for hostel accommodation.

SKILL DEVELOPMENT FACILITIES

1. Vermicomposting Unit: The college has a Vermicomposting Unit under Department of Zoology where vermi-compost as well as leaf compost is produced from cowdung and other plant wastes. Under the project entitled “Production Standardization and Utilization of Vermicompost for Sustainable Livelihood Generation” of Directorate of Biotechnology, Govt. of Tripura, the college is running a “Bio Tech Club” in the unit with student and faculty members since 2022.

2. Mushroom Cultivation Training Centre: College has a “Mushroom Cultivation Training Centre” under the Department of Botany which provides hands-on-training on mushroom cultivation.

STUDENT SUPPORT FACILITIES

1.State & Central Government Scholarship Schemes: Government Scholarship Schemes extend financial support to the needy and eligible students.

2.Placement Cell: College Placement Cell, in conjunction with DHE, Tripura, facilitates career counselling and placement related activities of the institute.

3.Anti-Ragging Cell: The college has an anti-ragging cell headed by one senior faculty member with other faculties as members, who can be contacted privately for any Ragging incident in the college campus.

SCOPE OF EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES FOR STUDENTS

1. **National Service Scheme (NSS)** The college encourages the students to join NSS and serve the nation building process and contribute to the holistic development of the society. The college also has a Red Ribbon Club that works under the NSS unit of the college in collaboration with the Tripura State Aids Control Society.
2. **National Cadet Corps (NCC)** The College strives to inculcate moral values and patriotism among its students through participation in NCC. A total of 19 Boys and 14 Girls are enrolled for NCC under 13-Tripura BN Boys and 71 Tripura Girls unit in this college. They are also groomed for national duty and its a matter of great pride for the college that a few cadets have participated in the national level camps. A number of cadets from this college have secured jobs in the military and para-military forces in the recent past.
3. **Cultural Activities** The College has separate committees, namely 'Cultural Committee', 'Committee for Drama, Debate and Literary Activities' and 'Magazine Committee' for execution and monitoring of cultural and literary activities. The committee members supervise the Saraswati Puja and other cultural activities performed during Fresher's Welcome, celebration of national and international commemorative events, etc.
4. **Sports Activities:** The students are encouraged to participate in inter - college, state, national and international level sports competitions. Separate committee for 'Sports and Games' is there to plan, execute and monitor the issues relating to games and sports.

DRESS CODE

Boys- Navy blue coloured trousers and full sleeved sea green shirt.

Girls- Ash-coloured kameez with sky blue salwar and sky-blue dupatta.

The students are required to follow strictly the prescribed dress code when in college and attend the classes wearing the specified college uniform only.

COLLEGE CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

- Faculty members, office staff and students have to work together in a spirit of co-operation and harmony for achieving excellence.
- Students should be in college uniform and carry identity card issued by the college authority.

INSTRUCTION FOR ADMISSION TO FIRST SEMESTER UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME IN GENERAL DEGREE COLLEGES OF TRIPURA DURING ACADEMIC SESSION 2023-24.

A. Eligibility:

- i) A student who has passed Higher Secondary/H.S.(+2 stage)/ Senior Secondary examination or equivalent from any recognized board/Council shall be eligible for admission to the 1st Semester of Under Graduate (B.A./B.Sc/B.Com/B.Music) programme subject to availability of seats. The students shall be taken into consideration for admission if he/she applied within five years from year of passing. The year of admission shall not be taken into account while calculating five years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.
- ii) For B.Sc. (Physical Science): A candidate who has passed 10+2 stage with Physics, Chemistry, and Mathematics shall be eligible for admission.
- iii) For B.Sc. (Biological Science): A candidate who has passed 10+2 stage with Physics, Chemistry and Biology shall be eligible for admission.
- iv) For B.Com. Programme: A candidate who has passed 10+2 with Commerce/Science will be eligible to take admission in B.Com.

v) For B.A. Programme: A candidate who has passed 10+2 in any stream shall be eligible to take admission.

B. Selection Procedure:

- i) Major, Minor & Interdisciplinary subjects should not be same.
- ii) A student can apply for maximum three subjects as Major in a particular college. Major subject will be allotted strictly on the basis of merit.
- iii) Students will mention four subjects as Minor in order of preference (mentioning four subjects as Minor in the application is mandatory for students applying for Arts Programme).
- iv. Students will mention four subjects for Interdisciplinary Course in order of preference (mentioning four subjects in the application is mandatory for students applying for Arts Programme).
- v. The merit list will be prepared on the basis of sum of marks of Best Five subjects of H.S.(+2) Exam and the subject opted for Major
 - a. If there is a tie in the sum, preference will be given on the marks obtained in the subject opted as Major (for breaking the tie).
 - b. If marks of the subject opted as Major is also equal, then the date of birth of the candidate will be considered. Senior will be given chance.
- vi) The merit list will be published for Major subject only. vii) Minor and Interdisciplinary Subject will be distributed among the students subject to availability of seat.
- viii) Reservation policy of Government of Tripura will be followed.
- ix) During admission original School Leaving Certificate need to be submitted.
